Exciting changes to expand and strengthen the Friends as an arm of the Hauppauge Public Library are being finalized.

A by-law committee updated FOTA's original by-laws created over ten years ago. As our library has grown, evolved, and changed it was time to take a look at ourselves to become more relevant to current library needs.

The following highlights important changes approved by the Friends and Library Boards. As of July 1, 2013 we will be the Friends of the Library. This expands our mission allowing us to support capital endeavors as well as cultural events.

Our Membership year changes from fiscal to annual (Jan 1 to Dec 31 of each year). Current membership will be extended to December 31, 2013. New members can join now and have membership extended thru December 31, 2014, an extra 5 months. Life membership remains at \$50 per person and \$75 a family-never having to think dues again. Annual membership is \$5 per person and \$10 per family.

Friends will be led by an executive board of 4 people backed and supported by a governing council of active core members wishing to assist in events. Terms of office are extended from 1 year to 2 years. My two years as president comes to a close June 30th. I thank the FOTA Board for your support, help, guidance, expertise, time and energy. The last two years were successful on many levels. I

could not have done it without everyone's help. Special thank you to Sue Sparago for organizing our 2nd Annual Hauppauge School District Writing Contest and Rose Milazzo for planning the 8th Annual Photography Contest.

I'm delighted to report Dorothy Becker will head the new executive board taking Friends into the future. I wish the new board every success as we realign to strengthen our library support.

The Friends board is open to all. We need new people, new ideas and new energy. Come to a board meeting. Join us as we help our library be the best it can be. **Our next board meeting is Monday, June 17th at 1 pm.** As always-everyone is welcome.

Our summer events include a Friday evening Summer Concert Series, a walk and tour of the Vanderbilt Museum in Centerport and a Lauren Kristy Boat Trip on Great South Bay.

In celebration of our library's 14th anniversary we have engaged the Spuyten Duyvel 7 Piece Folk Band for September 15th at 2:00pm. Mark your calendar for an anniversary complete with outstanding entertainment and refreshments for all.

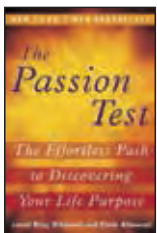

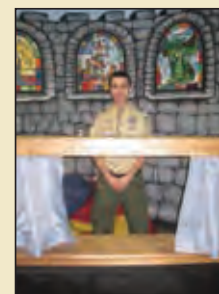

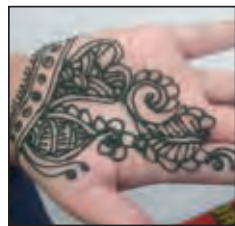
