To Our Community,

This summer the Board invited the entire community to a series of workshops to help answer key questions about building a permanent home for our library in Hidden Pond Park. Over the course of three lengthy workshops 1,640 person-hours were spent helping to determine the purpose of the project, its goals, and finally a conceptual design for the permanent home. Then the Board asked the community how much more per year in library taxes it would be willing to pay for the new home. After we finish sifting through the collected information, a determination can be made on the new building's size and features.

We wanted to thank all those who attended one, two or all three of our workshops. Without your time and efforts we would not have the answers we need to move forward. We asked a lot of the community, and were happy with the attendance and support received.

We have finalized the design team with the selection of an architecture firm. That team will begin meeting in late August to start developing schematic designs. Once a design is nearing completion, expect to see drafts posted in the library, with places seeking your ongoing input, comments and critiques. The permanent home will be stronger for your continued feedback.

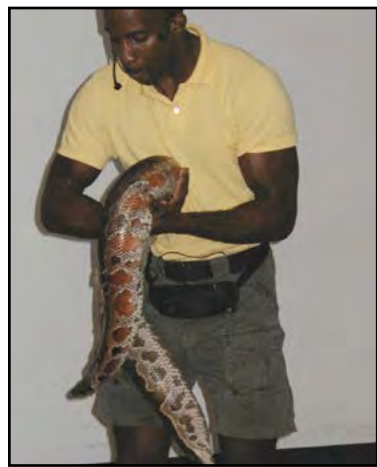

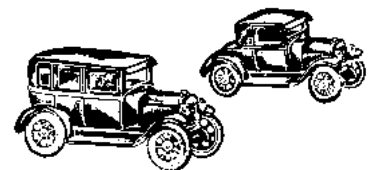

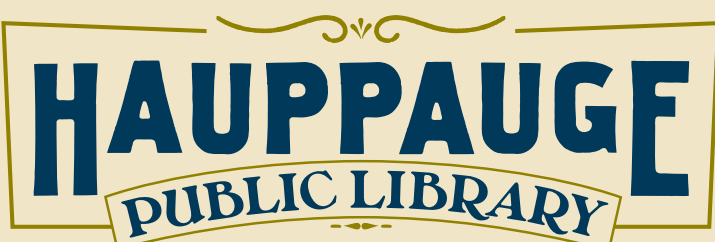
