Join us on Sunday, August 17 for our end-of-summer celebration featuring Eric's Reptile Edventures. See page 3 for details.



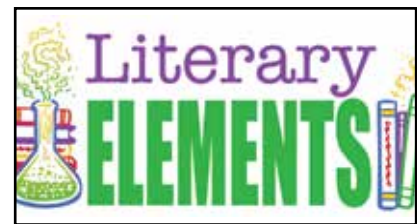
TEEN: SPARK A REACTION

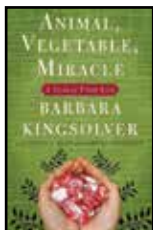

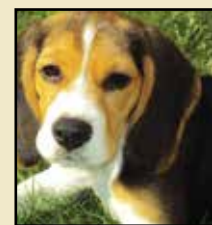

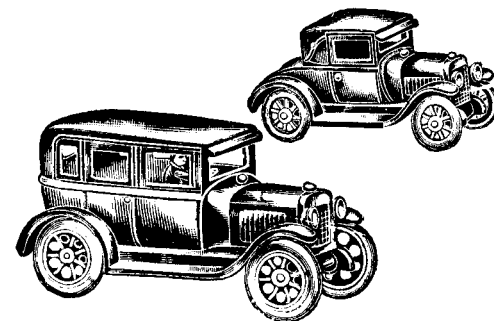
